Primary, school-based nursery and maintained nursery staff will be supplied with lateral flow device (LFD) test kits to self-swab. Staff will be asked to take their test kits home and carry out the test twice a week. The LFD test will give a result in around 30 minutes. Staff must report their result to NHS Test and Trace as soon as the					

test is completed either online or by telephone as per the instructions in the home test kit. Staff should also share their result with their school or nursery to help with contact tracing.

<p>This contingency plan (COVID-19 outbreak plan) outlines how schools <u>would</u> operate if any of the approaches for easing and tightening of measures, including possible attendance restrictions, become necessary in their local area.
